## Frequently Asked Questions

- What period does the annual fee cover?  
*Memberships are for a twelve month period renewable during the quarter of your membership anniversary.*
- Do I need to provide my CV and what should it include?  
*Your CV is essential to determine eligibility for Full membership and to forecast when Associate members may be eligible to upgrade to Full membership. Your brief CV [e.g. 2-3 pages addressing key points] should clearly show the period of time worked and the relevance of tasks to environmental practice undertaken for each employer.*
- Do I need to provide proof of study and what sort of proof is accepted?  
*If you are currently enrolled in full or part-time study, we require a photocopy of either a Student ID or enrolment record showing name, institution and the current year. If you have completed relevant studies, please include a photocopy of either your final transcript (including completion statement) or degree with your application. Applicants who have at least five years' relevant work experience do not need to provide proof of study.*
- How long does my application take to process?  
*Associate and Full applications normally take two to three weeks to be approved by Council once all information and payment has been received. Student memberships are processed as soon as all information and payment are received.*
- What happens to my personal information?

## Code of Ethics

Under the Rules of Association of the Environment Institute of Australia, membership is contingent upon the member conforming with the letter and spirit of the Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct which from time to time is adopted by the Council of the Institute and ratified by members of the Institute in a General Meeting.

The following Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct was adopted by the Council of the Institute in April 1989 and ratified by members of the Institute in a General Meeting on the 10th day of October 1989. Until revoked or amended in accordance with the Rules of Association this Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct is that governing the professional activities of members of the Institute:

- The member shall carry out his or her professional activities, as far as possible, in accordance with emerging principles of sustainable development and the highest standards of environmental protection.
- The member shall at all times place the integrity of the natural environment and the health, safety and welfare of the human community above any commitment to sectional or private interests.
- The member shall be personally accountable for the validity of all data collected, analyses performed, or plans developed by the member, and for the scrutiny of all data collected, analyses performed or plans developed under the member's direction.
- The member shall actively discourage misrepresentation or misuse of work the member has performed or that which was performed under the member's direction.
- The member shall conduct professional activities, as far appropriate, in an interdisciplinary manner and recognise the need to collaborate with suitably qualified persons in subject areas where the member is less experienced.
- The member shall ensure the incorporation of environmental protection considerations from the earliest stages of project design or policy development.
- The member shall not conduct professional activities in a manner involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit, misrepresentation or bias.
- The member shall not advertise or present the member's services in a manner that may bring discredit to the profession.
