The 2009 amendments to the Resource Management Act (1991) established the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA). Streamlining the decision making process for nationally significant proposals, such as major infrastructure or public works projects, was a part of these reforms. In late 2009 Sarah was appointed to the position of Manager, Consenting at the Ministry for the Environment and she is responsible for all current EPA functions under the Secretary for the Environment.
