Read blogs, join industry groups and follow thought leaders on Twitter.

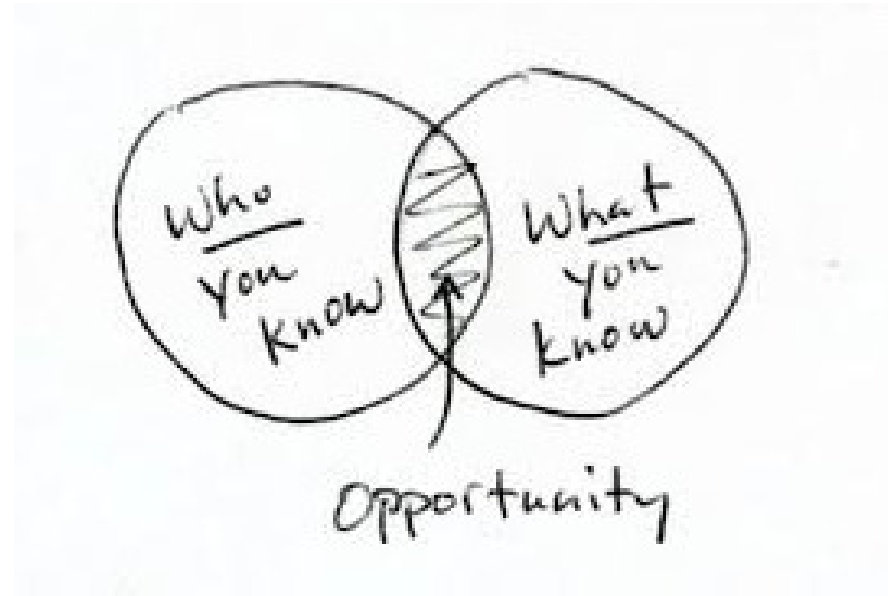

Make bold moves but be considered in your approach! Do your research before jumping in!





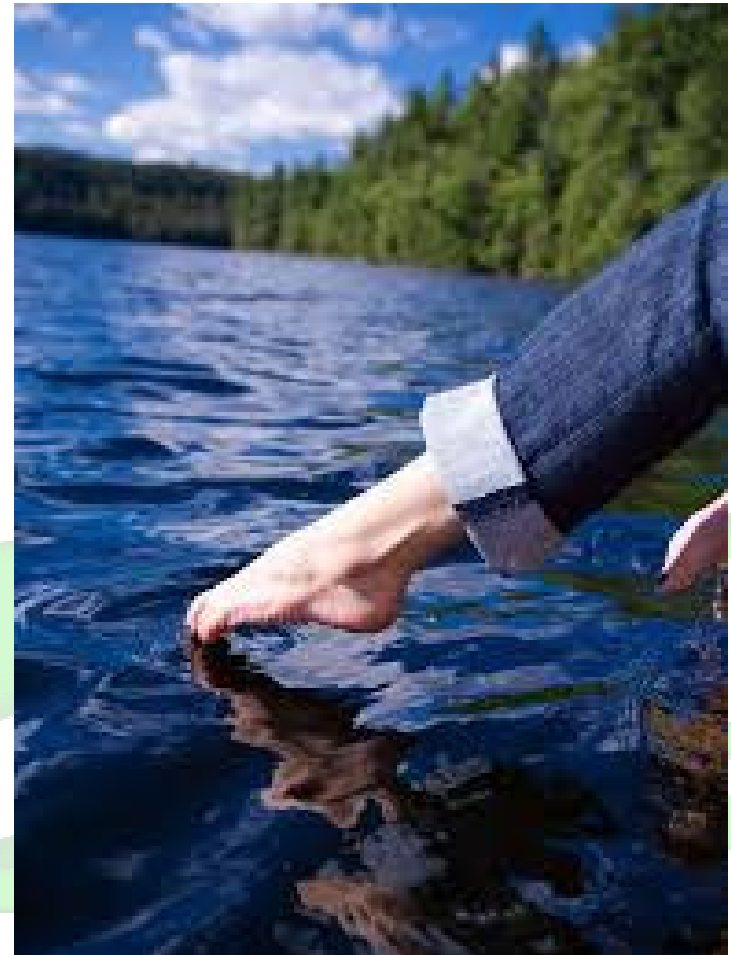

Eat your greens

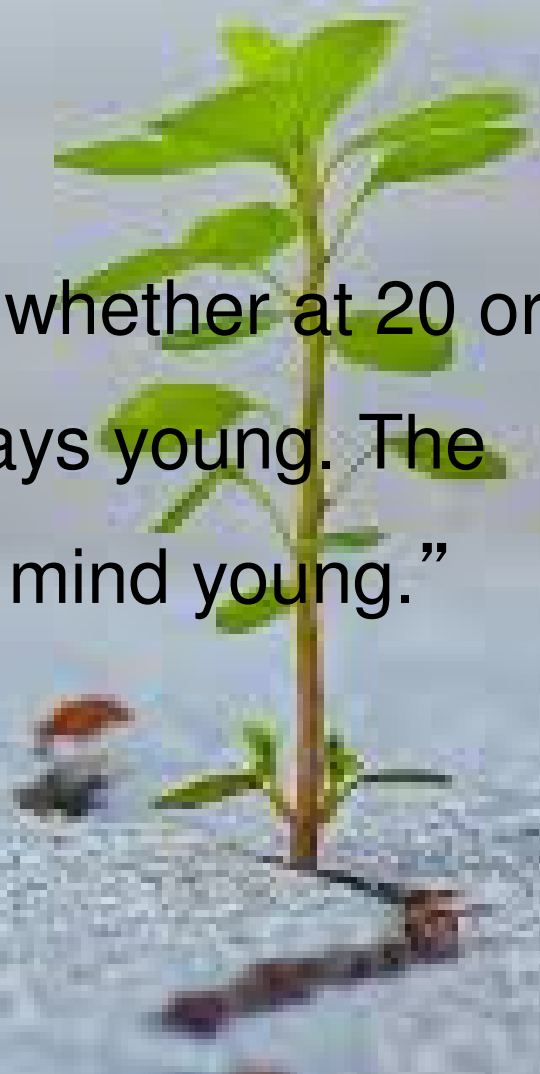
Plenty of opportunity to keep your environmental interests alive and up to date in this changing world.
