

# Change in Membership

Changing economic conditions have impacted on the employment of environmental practitioners and this is reflected in them not renewing their EIANZ membership. This has resulted in a decrease of 12% during 14/15.



### **Policy Contributions**

- Draft Planning and Development Bill 2014
