- High quality community and stakeholder engagement
- Co-ordinated and integrated assessment and approvals procedures
- Better environmental outcomes


Environmental impact assessment: Adding value for everyone

Why don't people like EIA?

- EIA costs too much
- EIA takes too long
- EIA causes stress and division in communities
- EIA is inherently biased when it is the proponent who prepares the EIS (or equivalent)
- EIA leads to foregone conclusions, especially for government projects
- Proponents are inequitably well-resourced relative to community objectors.
