



#### **NSW Statistics**


- > 270 camps in NSW
- ~ 115 with flyingfoxes in last two years
- ~ 30 nationally important
- ~ 20 with camp management plans
- 2 regional strategies

# Flying-fox Camp Management Policy 2015

- Regulatory framework
- Minimises health and amenity impacts while avoiding unnecessary harm
- Empowers land managers to work with their communities
- Strongly encourages development of camp management plans
- Hierarchy of implementation
  - Level 1, 2 and 3 actions



## Flying-fox Camp Management Policy 2015

- Level 1
  - Routine camp management actions
- Level 2
  - Creation of buffers
- Level 3
  - Camp disturbance or dispersal







### **Flying-foxes Grants Program**

- \$1 million available to councils
- Emergency camp management (up to \$50k)
- Developing plans (up to \$15k)
- Implementing plans (up to \$50k)
- Matching funds or in-kind contribution










### **Flying-foxes Netting Program**

- \$7.1 million for exclusion netting of commercial orchards since 2011
- Fixed canopy and throwover netting
- Total area netted is
  - > 700 hectares











- To maximise the number of threatened species that can be secured in the wild in NSW for 100 years
- Targeted conservation projects that set out the actions required to save specific plants and animals on mapped management sites
- GHFF: Habitat restoration a priority
