





## IRON ROAD APPROVALS

With Iron Road's Central Eyre Iron Project on the verge of obtaining final government approval, Environment Manager Steve Green will discuss the project's path to approval, and reflect on the importance of early impact assessment in shaping the project and achieving better outcomes.

### STEVE GREEN

Steve is Environment Manager at Iron Road and Executive Director – Assessments and Approvals at environmental consultancy JBS&G.

Steve has been working on the Iron Road Central Eyre Iron Project for over four years and has managed the development of the two approval documents – the Mining Proposal and Environmental Impact Statement covering supporting infrastructure.



Steve has been the Environment Manager at Olympic Dam and previously managed the Olympic Dam Expansion EIS for BHP Billiton. He brings a large deal of experience in impact assessment and approvals for major projects as well as environmental management of operational projects, and has unique insight into the way we assess and approve major projects.
