Phillippa Biswell is the Environmental Project Officer - Earth Scientist at Sutherland Shire Council, specialising in Contaminated Land Issues, Acid Sulphate Soils and Environmental Management. Over the last 12 years with Sutherland Shire Council, she has worked on improving planning records and policies that identify, assess and process contaminated lands as thoroughly and efficiently as possible within the scope of relevant legislation. Her development of a contaminated lands information register is a major achievement that ensures lands to be developed are suitable for their intended use. Her latest challenge is how to deal with the increasing number of EMP's and where to record this information.

Phillippa has regularly provided assistance to the EPA, councils and industry associations with contaminated land planning enquiries, review of policies, programs and legislation and has provided assistance in setting up CLIR systems and associated processes. Regular attendance at contaminated lands conferences, workshops and seminars as either a presenter or attendee has ensured that her knowledge of the legislation, investigation and remediation methods and practices is kept up to date.

Ross Fox | Senior Associate, Fishburn Watson O'Brien


