Estuaries are one of the most at risk ecosystems in the world. Porirua Harbour is an interesting mix of the three key threats to such systems: sedimentation, contamination and ecological restoration. An award-winning, multi-disciplinary, multi-agency strategy has been developed by councils in partnership with iwi (tribe) and local community. Here are learning opportunities about community engagement, strategy development, strategy implementation, the essential interface between science and management, urban versus rural, storm water and wastewater, community education, governance issues, local government dynamics and catchment management. 
