- Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act)
- Matters of National Environmental Significance Listed threatened species


Grey-headed flying-fox (vulnerable)

- Spectacled flying-fox (vulnerable)
- Christmas Island flying-fox (critically endangered)




Grey-headed flying-fox

- EPBC status: vulnerable
- EPBC listing date: 6 Dec 2001
- Listing criteria met: eligible under criteria 1 – decline in numbers
- Recovery plan: required
- Recovery plan status: a final version to be recommended to the Minister shortly



Spectacled flying-fox

- **EPBC status:** vulnerable. A nomination to up list to endangered is being considered
- EPBC listing date: 14 May 2002
- Listing criteria met: eligible under criteria 1 – decline in numbers and Criteria 5 – probability of its extinction in the wild is at least 10% in the medium-term future
- Recovery plan: yes
- Recovery plan status: Qld Government plan adopted 21 Apr 2011



Christmas Island flying-fox

- EPBC status: critically endangered
- EPBC listing date: 3 January 2014
- Listing criteria met: eligible under criteria 1 – decline in numbers
- Recovery plan: required
- Recovery plan status: no adopted or made recovery plan
- Conservation advice: approved





Referral guidelines

- Actions that may have a significant impact need approval under the EPBC Act
- Significant impact guidelines 1.1

Camp management

- Referral guidelines for camp management actions (2015)
 - nationally important camps
 - best practice standards
- Actions consistent with the guidelines do not need to be referred

Regulating impacts

Conservation agreements

- Benefit may include declaration that EPBC Act approval of actions is not required
- Requirements:
 - net benefit
 - not inconsistent with a recovery plan, threat abatement plan, or wildlife conservation plan
 - legally binding
- Examples Sunshine Coast & Eurobodalla (Batemans Bay)

Parliamentary Inquiry

- November 2016 inquiry into the impact of nationally protected flying-foxes on communities in the eastern states of Australia
- 67 submissions
- Department's submission summarised the legislative and policy framework for the Australian Government's involvement in flying-fox management
- 24 Nov 2016 round table forum
- 27 February 2017 Report ('Living with fruit bats') tabled in Federal Parliament
- The Australian Government is considering its response
