




If you are an experienced ecological practitioner, you can apply to have your skills and ethics recognised through the Certified Environmental Practitioner (CEnvP) Scheme.

Ecologists are eligible to apply for CEnvP Ecology Specialist certification when they have:

- At least 10 years ecology experience
- Hold an ecology-related degree
- Have demonstrated a commitment to training and professional improvement
- Shown they are a respected, competent, ethical and active member of the profession.

The CERTIFIED ENVIRONMENTAL PRACTITIONER SCHEME is an initiative of EIANZ aimed at boosting community and business confidence in environmental professionals. The CEnvP scheme recognises environmental professionals in line with their professional counterparts from engineering, accounting, planning and architecture. Environmental practitioners must meet high standards of professional and ethical conduct to gain certification
