What is 'landscape'







Its meaning

- "...an understanding of landscape moves from being a more or less visible and tangible entity to being inclusive of the subjective matter of the mind. In such light the importance of the perceptions of those who experience the landscape is drawn into focus.
 Comprehending the perceptions, meanings and values of a landscape is based on the knowledge and its articulations by those who encounter the landscape."
 - Butler and Åkerskog 2014, Awareness-raising of landscape in practice. An analysis of Landscape Character Assessments in England

Landscape meaning

- Inevitably about values
 - what it 'is'
 - What we perceive, assign or hold
- It is
 - Biophyiscal
 - Built
- Perceived
 - Recreational
 - Aesthetic
 - Economic etc

In an Australian context?

- What about 'Country'
- I acknowledge the Elders, families and forebears of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples of the Australian continent, islands and adjacent seas, who remain the spiritual and cultural custodians of their lands and waters and who continue to practice their values, languages, beliefs and customs.

Traditional knowledge

- Writing on First Nation knowledge in Canada, José Mailhot (1994: 11) :
 - ...the sum of the data and ideas acquired by a human group on its environment as a result of the group's use and occupation of a region over very many generations.

'Country'

- People talk about Country in the same way that they would talk about a person: they speak to Country, sing to Country, visit Country, worry about Country, grieve for Country and long for Country. People say that Country knows, hears, smells, takes notice, takes care, and feels sorry or happy. Country is a living entity with a yesterday, a today and tomorrow, with consciousness, action, and a will toward life. Because of this richness of meaning, Country is home and peace: nourishment for body, mind and spirit; and heart's ease.


Landscape and IA

Figure 1 Location of the Great Victoria **Desert** bioregion









Assessed Impacts

- EPBC Act issues
 - One Priority Ecological Community (PEC) could be within the proposed infrastructure corridor (Yellow Sandplains Community).
 - Endangered Sandhill Dunnart known in GVD
 - Threatened Malleefowl known in GVD
- ASSUME for case study, habitats lost
- Normally direct offset





Fire management

Benefits

- Better fire management better protection of existing habitats of 2 species
- Most native species also benefits
- TOs stay on country


Perth and Peel at 3.5 million

- Perth at 2.1 million clearing of 71% of remnant vegetation;
- Perth and Peel at 3.5 million only an additional 3% loss of vegetation – total 74%
- Includes 23,000 ha of pines to be cleared

Case study - Perth – Darwin National Highway (Swan Valley Section)

- loss of 207.2 ha of foraging habitat for Carnaby's Black Cockatoo
- loss of 120.5 ha of foraging habitat for Forest Red-tailed Black Cockatoo
- Offset 673.5ha land purchase and on-going management

Project and Offset Boundaries



Landscape scale alternative

- Contribute to urban forest across whole of Perth Peel region;
- Provide trees/native vegetation to residents for street verges and local parks;
- Strengthens links of people and nature
- Reduces heat island effect
