<p><b>4. Treasurer's report.</b></p> <p>Treasurer's report attached.</p> <p>The report reflects this FY against last five years FY. Event income has significantly increased compared to last couple of years events. This enables the Division to be more financially independent from central to be able to run programs such as mentoring programs.</p> <p>Highlighted the limited funds received from Central regarding membership fees and how the Division therefore focuses on the support that we can get from Central, including the event registration support and other activities. Significant changes have been made in Central office to improve financial viability and the focus has allowed Central Office to become more financially secure and support members.</p> <p>What does the balance sheet look like? The balance is quite healthy and split between two accounts; the current account is around \$27,250.68. The second account will \$13,184.62.</p> <p>Key expenses, events, audit fees bank charges etc. quarterly GST payments</p> <p>Event numbers registered, more attended than registered. Continuing to employ a differential between members and non-members at events to improve membership numbers but also create more funding opportunities to support members.</p> <p>Sarah Osborne moved to accept Treasurer's report.
