

EPBC Act Review – Webinar Series

Helping to shape our Federal environment legislation

The Institute is compiling a comprehensive submission to the discussion paper released as part of the independent review of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act (1999).

We are leading the way for environmental practitioners to become involved in the review process; in late March to early April a webinar series will be held across two weeks which will aim to:

- Provide an opportunity for environmental practitioners to gain information relating to the review process specific areas of focus
- Harness the skills and expertise of people that work closely with the Act to refine the Institute's submission to the discussion paper
- Position the Institute and environmental practitioners to participate in the review process beyond the discussion paper.
