ONLINE WORKSHOPS

In June, EIANZ is offering another round of Introductory Workshops in Organized Reasoning, following the series of successful workshops last year. But we now have something more. These Advanced Workshops will offer “more tools” for argument and writing for people who have attended the introductory workshops in 2019 or 2020. Under current circumstances, they are all online.

Their topics will include:

- A brief review of fundamental principles of organised reasoning
- Case studies using organised reasoning in an Australian context, including discussion and lessons learnt
- A practice exercise redrafting an executive summary
- Identifying and avoiding common errors of reasoning, called ‘fallacies’, that have a surface credibility
- Editing and restructuring a draft outline to better support a complex argument.

The workshop will be held as two 3-hour online sessions. They are not webinars, but include a variety of presentations, interactive discussions, small group break out activities and breaks to ensure you remain fresh and attentive! Participation is limited to 16 participants per workshop to enhance interaction.

PREREQUISITE

Workshop attendees must have completed the introductory workshops on ‘More effective impact assessment: Tools for stronger argument and clearer writing’ run by Dr Glenn Brown.

WORKSHOP LEADER

Dr Glenn Brown has over 25 years of experience as an ecologist and educator specializing in environmental management. He has worked on environmental projects for industry, government and non-governmental organizations in Canada and other countries. He teaches courses on Ecosystem Science and Management and on Analytical Thinking and Communications in the Masters program in Environment and Management at Royal Roads University in British Columbia and works as an independent consultant.

He has delivered courses on ‘Organised Reasoning’ at International Association for Impact Assessment (IAIA) conferences in Florence, Durban and Brisbane. He also provided the course through the IAIA affiliate in Western Canada, EIANZ in Australia and New Zealand, and in Iceland and Hong Kong.
