

Proposed changes to the EIANZ Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct: what has happened so far.

A <u>Special Resolution</u> was put forward by the EIANZ Board for consideration by members at the Institute's Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 10 November 2020. The resolution proposed changes to the Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct to acknowledge and value the rights and interests of Indigenous Peoples in environmental management. For the resolution to pass it needed at least a 75% in favour vote. The resolution was not passed at the AGM, however over 75% of members supported the intent of the resolution.

After the AGM, Bryan Jenkins, EIANZ President <u>invited feedback</u> from members and CEnvPs on the proposed changes. In December 2020, Bryan advised members and CEnvPs that <u>facilitated workshops</u> would be run in early 2021 to discuss the comments and how they have been addressed.
