IMPACT ASSESSMENT: GETTING ON THE FRONT FOOT IN A CHANGING WORLD SEPTEMBER 5-6 2022, ADELAIDE

OVERVIEW

In recent times impact assessment (IA), like many disciplines, has found itself in uncharted territory. The pressures of the Covid-19 pandemic, changes in the media, social and political contexts, the rise of social media and the ongoing threats of climate change and biodiversity decline mean that today's IA professionals must think more broadly and proactively than ever before. We need to address ongoing and emerging threats to our environment, changes to the regulatory context, changing expectations of society, the recognition of the importance of Traditional Owner knowledge and values, increasing community conflict and dynamic political attitudes.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

The EIANZ 2022 IA symposium brings together practitioners, regulators and researchers to explore these critical issues within the context of a changing world, to discuss and propose solutions. The symposium will enable discussion and collaboration about how IA professionals can lead the conversation and appropriately respond to these emerging trends.

- Defining the key components of next generation IA
- Biodiversity decline including threatened species IA
- Next steps in offsetting
- Unleashing the potential of digital IA
- Other foreword looking IA themes.
