 - role of EIANZ in the profession & community
 - Prepare submissions, positions, guides and discussion docs & references etc
 - Engage with Special Interest Sections
- EIANZ has five current position statements & two guidance notes
- In 2021/22 some submissions/social media posts via NZ Chapter, Ecology SIS/CoP, CC SIS & PSC
- CEnvP scheme, Practice & PD Cttee and Comms committee have intersecting interests with PSC
- PSC is recognised by Board for being active and carrying through on its commitments
- Some frustration within PSC
 - inability to tap into resources and expertise vis a vis a) EPBC act advocacy b) 2022 Election Statement
 - Maximising (and measuring) the impact of our work
 - Building a prioritised & anticipatory PSC modus operandi for timely future responses

What to do

- Committee membership Recruit new members onto PSC – to bring the total to ~14.
- 2. Consult on priorities
 - Engage with President, Advisory Council, Chapter, Divisions, SISs and Members on their priorities for the PSC and for position statements.
- 3. Maintain & add to a suite of relevant position statements
 - CC & Ecology SISs to review their PSs.
 - Approach Fellows / Members to assist in review of the water PS
 - Encourage completion of environmental education PS
 - Solicit support for Circular Economy PS
- 4. Promotion of sound policy implementation
 - Campaign for sensible climate policy, Samuel EPBC recommendations and Aotearoa NZ RMA reform, water and climate policy
 - Support SISs and COPs in engaging on priority national and regional policy development
 - Support Divisions in engaging on priority State-based issues incl election statements

Where do we want to be

- A valued and rewarding committee for EIANZ members and fellows to participate in
- Harnessing the expertise within and across the EIANZ
- Raising esteem for environmental professionals
 and their work
- Establishing and promoting good environmental practice within the profession and by all levels of decision makers
- Facts based prioritised input to Australian and Aotearoa New Zealand environmental regulatory framework
 - Demonstrating the value of EIANZ and of membership – to actual and prospective members

How to get there

- Leverage off the Annual Conference and other "big events" – to communicate and advance PSC work and solicit views on priorities.
- Work with Central Office on piloting "commissioned work"

- Work collaboratively Engage to align with CEnvP scheme, Practice & PD and Comms committee to ensure alignment,
- Keep the work in the election statement alive as a "integrated" EIANZ "ask" for environmental policy reform
- Stronger tracking on upcoming policy development and important document releases (to be done with CO)
- Seek that President meets with the new Australian Environment Minister to promote policy action

Policy and Standards Committee Mandate – as per Board 2021

Role: to support the Board with sound advice on:

- environmental policy, and advocacy of that policy, and
- the role of the EIANZ in the environmental profession and the community.

Terms of Reference

- 1. Facilitate the development, review and authorisation by the Board of EIANZ policy and position statements, guidelines, discussion papers, and other policy publications
- 2. Oversee and commission the preparation of:
 - a. Submissions to public enquiries and responses to public reports and policy statements relevant to the purposes of the EIANZ.
 - b. Policy and position statements, guidelines, discussion papers, and other publications on good practice environmental policy and management,
 - c. Annotated references to regional, national and international documentation relating to good practice environmental management.
- 3. Facilitate the engagement of Special Interest Sections in the development, review and preparation of position statements, guidelines, discussion papers, and other publications on environmental policy.

Position Statements and Guidance

The **purpose** of position statements is to:

- Communicate what the Institute stands for on environmental issues and important environmental practice topics
- Demonstrate leadership
- Drive action
- Support excellence in environmental practice
- Provide guidance on difficult and emerging issues and topics

The **structure** of position statements should include:

- Why issue or topic is important
- What are the key issues and aspects
- What the Institute's position is
- The rationale for that position
- What are the actions required of the Institute, its members and others
- What are the recommendations for action
- Links to case studies or practice/guidance notes if available
