ABSTRACT

The B&B Highway: Boosting urban biodiversity through a successful school, corporate and university initiative

The urban regenerative B&B Highway is the flagship program of the PlantingSeeds Projects organisation. Through its educational and practical applications and collaborations with the Department of Education, the CSIRO's Atlas of Living Australia, professional environmental educators, university researchers and landscape architects, it has succeeded in establishing over 150 'B&B's' – Bed and Breakfasts for Birds, Bees and Biodiversity – in three States: NSW, Queensland and Victoria

Pre- and post-planting monitoring and evaluations through pollinator and floral assessments developed by university researchers and triangulated with citizen science insights, show a 10 per cent increase in range and breadth of pollinators in B&Bs.

B&Bs are mainly located in urban schools with endemic native plantings chosen for each site to support threatened pollinators. Through implementing regenerative urban plantings in school Local Government Area clusters, corridors for biodiversity are established. Four indoor educational sessions are matched with outdoor skills-building sessions in the following areas: local biodiversity (and outside biodiversity hunt); plants and pollinators (outside plantings); citizen science learnings and activities contributing to the Atlas of Living Australia; and constructed habitat teachings and applications.

PlantingSeeds has collaborated with local government and corporate organisations in the implementation of the B&B Highway. Government organisations include the City of Parramatta Council, Moreton Bay Regional Council, the City of Melbourne Council, and City of Liverpool Council. The initiative has also been supported by Bendigo Bank, AW Edwards, Western Sydney Airport, QBE Insurance, K&L Gates and The Landscape Foundation of Australia. The educational and practical B&B Highway program allows organisations to support local regenerative urban corridors through planting and increasing biodiversity in schools in their areas.
