Her research area is the study of health impacts associated with exposure to air pollution, with a special interest in the effects of traffic related air pollution. She is currently engaged in a range of work including EPA and NSW Health Ministry commissioned reviews on particulate matter and indoor air quality; analysing data on gene-environment interactions of the effect of traffic related air pollution on respiratory health, studying personal exposures to NO2, and implementing exposure assessment methods for air pollution-health studies.
