Porirua Harbour Restoration Update: 10 Years On

In 2008, the Porirua Harbour restoration programme kicked-off in earnest. Keith, after 10 years in the box seat is still learning valuable lessons, and not necessarily ones you might expect.

Wetland Hydrology Assessments and Restoration Planning around New Zealand, a collaboration with Department of Conservation.

Jacobs are working with the Department of Conservation (DOC) on three large wetlands from the top of the North Island to the bottom of the South. These are some of the largest wetland complexes in New Zealand, which all have various degrees of degradation from human modifications (primarily drainage). The project aims to assess the hydrological characteristics of each site, which will help in planning long term restoration. This presentation will discuss some of the sites, evaluate the data collected over the last 6 months, and consider the future goals.
