Saving our Species is the NSW Government's flagship threatened species conservation program which aims to secure the future of as many threatened plants and animals as possible.

The SoS program is a statewide framework for species conservation that prioritises and coordinates efforts. It is a substantial rethink of how threatened species conservation is undertaken in NSW.

The new biodiversity legislation has been in place for over 18 months now and has resulted in major changes to the environmental assessment process with respect to ecology in NSW.

Linda Bell from the SoS program will provide an overview of the SoS program and detail how SoS is delivering on the vision of maximising the number of threatened species that are secure for the next 100 years.

Rhidian Harrington, Director, Ecologist from Niche Environment and Heritage, also EIANZ NSW Vice President, will provide an overview on how the offset scheme is progressing and how it is affecting projects.
