WA black cockatoo species have experienced significant population decline from habitat loss from land clearing and competition for remaining natural hollows. Artificial nesting hollows (ANHs) has emerged as a vital conservation strategy for Carnaby's Black Cockatoo, supplementing natural hollows and supporting breeding efforts.

This informative event will outline how to successfully use ANHs through:

- Identifying ideal locations for ANHs
- Best practices for ANH construction and maintenance
- Insights into breeding behaviour and ecological needs
